Chronic absenteeism often signals deeper challenges like trauma, unstable home conditions, or a lack of basic needs. Since 1991, Truancy Intervention Project (TIP) Georgia has worked alongside dedicated volunteer attorneys to break generational cycles rooted in inequity and shift the narrative on absenteeism.

TIP volunteers play a critical role in helping keep kids in school, out of court, and on track for the education they deserve.

Become a Volunteer Attorney

TIP volunteer attorneys receive **CLE-eligible training, ongoing support** from a dedicated team, and the opportunity to build relationships that **lead to real change**—all while using your legal skills to change the course of someone's life.

► What you'll do

- **Represent a student** in truancy court proceedings as both attorney and Guardian ad Litem
- **Provide legal advocacy** and identify resources to **support school reengagement**
- **Attend all court hearings** related to the child's truancy case
- **Collaborate** with school social workers, judges, TIP staff, and families
- **Support the whole child**—academically, emotionally, and legally

► Requirements

- **Commitment:** 1 case per year, ~25 hours/case
- **Active member** of the Georgia Bar
- Willingness to **serve as a mentor and legal guide**
- **Passion** for youth advocacy, educational justice, and systemic equity
